RETURN OF THE SUNDAY OBLIGATION.

You will see overleaf, the letter from the bishops of Scotland, which they asked specifically to be read **and** also to be made available in print to everyone. For that reason, I will not preach this weekend but simply read the letter - the thrust of which is the bishops have now decided to impose the Sunday obligation on all Catholics as from the first Sunday in January. This year that falls on the 2nd of January. I'm conscious also that Christmas and New Year's day fall on a Saturday. I don't expect there would be many who would want to attend a vigil Mass on either of those two Saturdays (*i.e. the 25th December and the 1st of January*), so I will provide a revised Sunday Mass timetable and publish it next week.

Feast of the Immaculate Conception

The feast of the Immaculate Conception will be celebrated with a Solemn Mass on the evening of the 8th of December at 7:00 PM. The music will be led by Motherwell Diocesan Music Group. I look forward to welcoming many from the parish and from outside the parish for this lovely feast which has a connection to Lourdes. When asked by Bernadette Soubirous what was her name '*The Lady*', as Bernadette referred to her, said "**I am the Immaculate Conception**" – a title that meant nothing to Bernadette but which, lest she forget, kept repeating over and over again on her way to tell her Parish Priest. The priest was then convinced him at that point that Bernadette had seen the Virgin Mary. Since the Grotto is dedicated to Our Lady of Lourdes, I though it appropriate that we should celebrate this solemnity with fervour and devotion.
