PREPARING FOR MASS WHAT IS GOD SAYING TO US TODAY?



N THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT, the liturgy puts before us the tempting of Jesus. Because Jesus shared our humanity, he was tempted in every way that we are, yet was without sin. As we begin this Holy Season of Lent our Mother, the Church wants to remind us that all of us struggle with temptation but, at the same time, there is nothing we cannot master with the help of the One who strengthens us.

GENESIS recounts the tempting and fall of Adam and Eve. It illustrates the psychology of temptation. The cunning serpent succeeds in portraying God as unreasonable and jealous. The source of all evil, the writer suggests, is man's foolish striving to be independent of God.

The result of Adam and Eve's disobedience is that there is in human beings a sinful tendency which goes beyond personal sins we may commit. This basic tendency towards evil is part of the corruption that human beings introduced into the world, not an endowment of God.

The story of the tempting of Adam and Eve prepares us to hear the tempting of Jesus in the Gospel.

ROMANS St Paul portrays Jesus as the new Adam, who by his obedience to God restores for us the gifts lost by the disobedience of the first Adam.

GOSPEL St Matthew sees Jesus as reliving the history of his people. He goes into the desert for forty days and forty nights. This recalls the forty years the people spent in the desert, a period in which they were tempted but also enjoyed a special closeness to God. Jesus shares in the temptations of his people. But whereas they were found wanting, he remains faithful to God.

Our Mother, the Church invites us, Her children, to make use of these tried and tested ways that we might come closer to God and to each other. Please think carefully about how you will keep this Lent, 2020. If I may set each of you a challenge **ONE EXTRA MASS PER WEEK**.
